This full day session provides a comprehensive overview of the underlying pathophysiology of cancer cells, the specific blood and organ systems affected by cancers, and the associated treatment modalities. Increase your skills and knowledge on providing quality care to patients undergoing chemotherapy, radiation therapy or immunotherapy and the palliative care required.

Venous Access and Cannulation

This workshop explores the underpinning theory and techniques of venous access and cannulation. From here participants will have practical time to learn about the appropriate techniques for phlebotomy and cannulation, best practice, and available devices. During this session, participants will work on simulated arms. This is a hands on session for participating attendees.

This full day session is focused on core nursing practices. Participants will learn the mandatory training requirements expected by the healthcare industry. Topics covered and skills that will be assessed on the day include:

- Hand hygiene
- Aseptic technique
- Medication management
- Basic life support
- Fire and emergency awareness

FD Full day

This study day will allow participants to complete the basic mandatory training requirements needed to work in the healthcare industry. In the morning we will focus on the five moments of hand hygiene, along with theory based learning on the concept of aseptic technique and safe manual handling principles. In the afternoon we will move onto practical activities involving medication management and basic life support, with an assessment of both.
