Baptcare Karingal Workload Issues and Enterprise Agreement Negotiations to commence

The Australian Nursing and Midwifery Federation Tasmanian Branch (ANMF) are pleased to announce that Baptcare have agreed to commence Enterprise Agreement negotiations with the first meeting scheduled for early March 2023. ANMF officials will be onsite on **Wednesday 15 February 2023** to discuss the Log of Claims.

The ANMF has also been contacted by Karingal members with workload concerns. Consistent themes from nurses and care workers are:

- Care workers and nurse's workload have been significantly impacted by the recent changes to catering services.
- Short notice of leave shifts are not always filled.
- Missed meal and hydration breaks.
- Members care deeply and want the best for residents but feel unable to provide the appropriate level of care to residents with the staffing levels available.

The ANMF has suggested some solutions to address member concerns and requested formal feedback from Baptcare Karingal management by **close of business Tuesday 21 February 2023** this will be reviewed once the response is received. The ANMF will then schedule a meeting with members to discuss the details, seek members clarification and future direction.
