Clinical Nurse Educators in District Hospitals

The Australian Nursing and Midwifery Federation Tasmanian Branch (ANMF) has been attending Public Sector Enterprise Negotiations on behalf of all public sector members. Relevant to all members in District Hospitals (DHs), we are pleased to report we have negotiated and received “in principle” support for dedicated Clinical Nurse Educators (CNEs).

The Tasmanian Health Service (THS) has agreed that CNEs are required in all DHs, and that this allocation should be equitable across the state. We understand that whilst there are CNEs available for all DHs, presently some are centrally located with an outreach to sites and others are physically located at the sites. The ANMF understands that further work will be conducted by the THS to undertake an assessment of the CNE role in DHs currently, the future requirements and resourcing required.

The ANMF anticipate that this commitment will be included as part of the Public Sector Enterprise Agreement offer, so as further information is provided on this matter, the ANMF will ensure to update members accordingly.
