Correctional Primary Health Service (South) Award Compliant Roster Pattern Change

The Australian Nursing and Midwifery Federation Tasmanian Branch (ANMF) is writing to members to provide an update on a current matter in relation to the award compliant roster pattern change. The ANMF understand that this has been a challenging time for some of our members and invite members to continue to raise their concerns with your organiser if you still have questions. The ANMF can report that following two consultative periods in August no written feedback was provided but several conversations occurred verbally. The ANMF acknowledge that this case will involve more than just a new roster to close, including, the future of ADO banking, historical overtime back payment and an inquiry into the application of penalties.

In terms of the roster, the ANMF is awaiting input from HACSU and HR on the progress of HACSU's dispute. Now that HACSU are onboard with this case, the ANMF has written to HACSU to provide some clarity and a history of this case to date. The ANMF is happy to wait for HACSU to be satisfied that they have had an opportunity to consult but apologise to ANMF members for the delay in resolving this case.

The ANMF would welcome a further member meeting to discuss this matter in conjunction with HACSU once a response to their letter is received.
