Step 2 Specialist Panel Update

On Wednesday 29 November 2023, the Australian Nursing and Midwifery Federation Tasmanian Branch (ANMF) attended the 6D Specialist Panel to seek resolution of the LGH 6D Step 2 Grievance. The following recommendations have been deduced from the meeting and will now be submitted to the Chief Executive of Hospitals (CE.H) North for approval:

- 1. The Nursing Benchmarking Business Case from February 2023 benchmarking has progressed to recruitment, and this matter will be resolved in line with the recruitment timeframes.
- 2. The Business Case for the Clinical Coaches is to be re-submitted to the CE.H by close of business Wednesday 13 December 2023 for consideration.
- 3. The Executive Director of Nursing and Midwifery to provide the ANMF a copy of the 'NUM Workload Concept Brief' when endorsement by the Nursing Directors occurs.
- 4. There was acknowledgement that recruitment is underway to permanently recruit against the vacant FTE (previously COVID funded positions), and this matter will be resolved in line with the recruitment timeframes.
- 5. Acknowledgement the Business Case to Support the Ward 6D AIN Trial has been submitted to the CE.H office for consideration. Outcome to be communicated to the ANMF following the DoM Monthly Accountability Meeting on the Wednesday 6 December 2023.
- 6. The Executive Director of Nursing and Midwifery endorsed the forwarding of Ward 6D skill mix data to the ANMF.

Please note that the approval status of several of the recommendations is pending with the Chief Executive of Hospitals North. If the recommendations are not supported, the matter remains unresolved, at which time the ANMF may refer to the Tasmanian Industrial Commission for assistance. We will keep you informed of any developments. Your ANMF team is here to support you.
