## The ANMF advocate for carers to be covered by the Nurses Agreement

The Australian Nursing and Midwifery Federation Tasmanian Branch (ANMF) officials attended the first enterprise negotiation meeting for members at The Salvation Army Barrington Lodge. At this meeting the ANMF strongly advocated for carer members to be included in the Nurses Agreement, as they are currently not covered by an agreement, and they work within the nursing team under the direction of the nurses. The employer is considering this proposal and will provide a response.

The ANMF also advocated for the Enrolled Nurse (EN) Classification to remain in the Nurses Agreement despite the redundancies being offered to ENs recently with no intention to replace ENs at this stage. The Employer has given their assurance that ENs will remain in the Nurses Agreement.

At this meeting, the ANMF presented their Log of Claims.

The next meeting has been scheduled for **Wednesday 27 March 2024** (date and time to be confirmed), ANMF workplace representatives will be able to attend this meeting in paid time.
