## TIC OUTCOME - ALL INDUSTRIAL ACTION TO CEASE THAT WILL IMPACT THE STATUS QUO

Empowering Care Ensuring Safety

The Australian Nursing and Midwifery Federation Tasmanian Branch (ANMF) today attended an urgent hearing in the Tasmanian Industrial Commission (TIC) related to the ongoing Status Quo order by the TIC and how this would be maintained in light of the Health and Community Services Union, paramedic member's Industrial Action.

The ANMF and members who were in touch with the ANMF over the weekend formed the view that the mitigating strategies being put in place by the Department of Health would not be sufficient to maintain the Status Quo order.

The view of the President of the Industrial Commission was that all industrial activity that was going to change the activity for nurses and midwives was not to commence as it was in breach of the Status Quo direction as it related to the original consultation dispute. Therefore, the Status Quo order has now been extended to paramedics and doctors, who are involved in the original dispute, lodged by the ANMF, as respondents.

The President noted that this did not preclude any Industrial Action that had no bearing on nurses and midwives.

A further conference will still be held on **Tuesday 9 April 2024** as originally set by the TIC.

The ANMF will continue to consult with members on the Transfer of Care change proposal in the lead-up to the next TIC conference.
