Members Endorse to Escalate Industrial Action

The Australian Nursing and Midwifery Federation Tasmanian Branch (ANMF) met with members on Friday 16 August 2024 to provide a further update on the Step One Grievance raised by the ANMF on behalf of members. Unfortunately, the Employer yet again failed to provide a response to member concerns by the requested extension date of Thursday 15 August 2024. The Employer has not provided a firm commitment on the timing of a response.

On Monday 12 August 2024, members commenced the following Industrial Action (IA):

1. Nurses will not be completing daily iPM entries

As the Employer is yet to provide a response to the Step One Grievance, members have unanimously endorsed the escalation of IA. In addition to the continuation of the above, effective Friday 16 August 2024, members will be commencing the following IA:

2. Nurses will be working to rule. For clarity, this means Grade 3-4 nurses will not be conducting intake assessments.

The ANMF has notified management of the escalation of members' action.

The ANMF will keep members informed of any update from the employer.

Any staff who are not ANMF members will need to join the ANMF to take part in the IA.
