Department of Critical Care Medicine 12 and a half hour shifts

The Australian Nursing and Midwifery Federation Tasmanian Branch (ANMF) is continuing to engage with the Department for better compensation for nurses working 12-hour shifts that include 30 minutes of additional time.

A difficulty has arisen from the fact that members return in their paper-based timesheets each week and therefore have limited time and wage records readily to hand.

Given the need to access timesheet records held by the Department, the Tasmanian Industrial Commission has extended the time for the ANMF to file evidence in our case.

As we continue to gather more information, the ANMF recommends that all members working 12 and a half hour shifts keep careful records, including keeping copies of each timesheet.

If you would like to be part of assisting with the case, please let us know.

We are particularly interested in the experiences of part-time employees who work extra shifts. We could really benefit from information from this group.
