Queen Victoria Care

Delay in Initiation of Bargaining

As you may be aware, it is time to renegotiate the *Queen Victoria (QV) Care Nursing Enterprise Agreement 2021* and *General Staff Enterprise Agreement 2021*.

Over recent months, QV Care has been in communication with us about when bargaining for new agreements will begin.

We have been advised by management this morning that an administrative restructure is being undertaken, so therefore have requested a delay in initiating bargaining until February 2025.

We have surveyed you as our members, organised member meetings, and drafted our Log of Claims. We are prepared and ready for negotiations to begin.

There are clauses in the current Nurses (clause 11) and General (clause 19) Agreements that require QV Care to consult with you in relation to a "major change" in your employment in certain circumstances.

QV Care have confirmed that the administrative restructure <u>will not</u> affect care worker and nursing employees in the context of needing to consult as it relates to executive support services, and they remain fully compliant with the consultation clauses.
