N95 Mask Allowance

The Australian Nursing and Midwifery Federation Tasmanian Branch (ANMF) has been informed by the Department of Health that the majority of back payments related to the N95 mask allowance have been processed. We value your feedback — if you find this statement inaccurate or have not received your back pay, please contact the ANMF Member Support Team, and we will follow up with the Department on your behalf.

The ANMF firmly believes that these back payments should have been completed at the beginning of 2024, and we see no justification for further delays. If you have received a back payment but suspect the amount is incorrect, we encourage you to reach out to payroll for a detailed breakdown to verify it against your own records. This allowance applies to all shifts worked from Friday 24 November 2023 where an N95 mask was required to be worn for 70% or more of the shift.
