Member Meeting Update, Workplace Concerns

After meeting with members, The Australian Nursing and Midwifery Federation Tasmanian Branch (ANMF) has raised several concerns with management.

Issues include:

Enrolled Nurses (ENs): The Tasmanian Health Service (THS) has made a commitment to grow the EN workforce to 30%. Despite this, ACMHS North have refused to continue with employment of ENs within the service. The ANMF recognises the significant contribution of ENs in Mental Health, and it is noted that ACMHS sites across the state employ ENs. The ANMF has requested management to re-consider the position that ENs cannot be employed in ACMHS North.

Application of Community Mental Health Multidisciplinary Allowance (MDA): The ANMF has requested further information on why the MDA is not being paid to members fulfilling case management roles within ACMHS.

Baseline Roster & Vacancies: The ANMF has requested information of the baseline roster, current vacancies, duration of the vacancies and any other planned or unplanned long-term leave impacting staffing within ACMHS.

Next Steps: The ANMF is committed to advocating for members in ACMHS, we encourage all members to stay engaged, share feedback, and participate in ongoing discussions as we work towards a resolution on these matters.
