ANMF Advocacy Secures Commitment for LGH Air-Conditioning Works

Australian Nursing and Midwifery Federation Tasmanian Branch (ANMF) members—your action and our advocacy has resulted in a major breakthrough!

The Minister for Health has now committed to air-conditioning works at the Launceston General Hospital, set to commence in **April 2025**.

At a meeting with the Minister yesterday, ANMF Secretary Emily Shepherd pushed for and confirmed the commitment. In addition to this, the ANMF sought confirmation that the works should also consider a **split-system solution**.

While we welcome this long-overdue progress, the ANMF will continue to **push for immediate interim cooling measures** to protect staff and patients, noting that the temperature in the D block yesterday pushed the 30-degree mark.

Our next steps include:

- Transparency on the engineers' report to ensure members are fully informed.
- Accountability for the previous \$4 million upgrade—was it spent, and where?
- Consultation process to hold THS accountable for both interim and long-term solutions.
