## Tasmanian Health Service – Emergency Departments

The ANMF Pushes for Emergency Department Market Allowance – Calls for Statewide Action

The Australian Nursing and Midwifery Federation Tasmanian Branch (ANMF) has formally written to the Department of Health requesting a **review of the decision to deny a Market Allowance of up to 20%** above the maximum salary for all nursing roles in the **Emergency Departments (EDs) across the state**.

Despite claims of "positive recruitment" by the Department, **vacancy data**, **ongoing staff shortages**, **and unsafe working conditions** paint a very different picture. The ANMF has outlined that ED nurses clearly meet the Award's criteria for a Market Allowance, including:

- Highly specialised skills required in emergency nursing
- Scarce skill availability in Tasmania, with evidence of rising vacancies
- Critical impact of understaffing on patient safety and service delivery
- A **competitive national market**, with significantly higher wages offered interstate.

We've also urged that this allowance be extended **to all EDs statewide**, including the Royal Hobart Hospital (RHH), which is currently experiencing dangerously low staffing levels.

Without urgent action, ongoing recruitment and retention challenges will continue to place significant pressure on the delivery of safe and effective emergency care across Tasmania.







The ANMF has requested a formal response by **close of business Monday 28 April 2025** and will continue to advocate for fair recognition and safe staffing levels for our ED members.
