



## **ANMF NEWSFLASH**

## Royal Hobart Hospital Emergency Department/Emergency Medical Unit Benchmarking Proposal & Member Feedback Request

On **Thursday 17 April 2025**, the Australian Nursing and Midwifery Federation Tasmanian Branch (ANMF) attended a benchmarking meeting for the Emergency Department (ED) and Emergency Medical Unit (EMU) at the Royal Hobart Hospital (RHH).

During this meeting, it was confirmed that **EMU staffing would remain unchanged**. For the ED, the proposed changes include an increase in direct care staffing, as outlined below:

## **Proposed ED Staffing Increases**

- Morning & Afternoon Shifts:
  - ➤ Increase of 3 direct care nurses per shift, 7 days per week.
- Night Shift:
  - ➤ Increase of 4 direct care nurses, 7 days per week.
- Morning/Afternoon & Night Shift:
  - ➤ Increase of 1 Assistant in Nursing (AIN) per shift, **7 days per week.**

While these proposed increases are welcome, the **ANMF has raised concerns** regarding the proposal to convert the **2.46 Full Time Equivalent (FTE) clinical coach roles from indirect to direct care**. Clinical coaches







provide critical support, guidance, and mentoring in this high-acuity and complex clinical area. Redirecting these roles to direct care would significantly reduce this vital support for ED staff.

The ANMF has **formally escalated this concern** to the **secretary of the Department of Health**, seeking to retain the 2.46 FTE clinical coach positions as **indirect care support**. While we await a response, we are also seeking **your feedback** on the overall proposal.
