The Australian Nursing and Midwifery Federation Tasmanian Branch (ANMF) met with members on Monday 19 May 2025 at The Hobart Clinic to listen to concerns across a range of issues.

Members have voiced concerns surrounding staffing level, workloads and workplace culture.

They also spoke about the upcoming Enterprise Agreement (EA).

Staffing Security, Workloads and Culture.

ANMF members raised grave concerns about the volatile staffing situation and resulting lack of clinical leadership and increasing workloads that is affecting the direct care of the clients they look after.

The ANMF has **heard** you and **supports** you in this unstable, concerning time.

The ANMF is currently developing a response to this situation that will provide security for members and ensure they are given the resources, support and staff required to ensure best patient outcomes are produced.

Upcoming EA

Members raised the upcoming EA as an issue, especially given the current climate.

The ANMF is working on a Log of Claims (LoC) and will be surveying members in the very near future.
