The ANMF Demands Urgent Action on LGH Air Conditioning and Heating Failures

The Australian Nursing and Midwifery Federation Tasmanian Branch (ANMF) has written to the Minister for Health to express our deep disappointment and growing concern over the Government's continued failure to deliver on promised upgrades to the Launceston General Hospital (LGH) air conditioning and heating systems.

Despite a public commitment in **February 2025** to upgrade the **LGH's** outdated and unsafe temperature control systems — following the **ANMF** member reports of **room temperatures reaching 40°C** — the government has failed to act. At that time, assurances were made that heating requirements would be addressed, with works **expected to commence in April 2025**.

However, at a recent consultative meeting, the **ANMF** was advised that:

- No works have commenced.
- Planning is still in early stages.
- No timeline has been confirmed.

With winter fast approaching, patients and staff are now facing cold overnight temperatures in wards that are already known to be unsafe in summer. Without immediate intervention, there is a very real risk that these same areas will again face extreme and unsafe conditions this coming summer.







This is yet another example of Government **overpromising and underdelivering** — and it is unacceptable.

The ANMF has called on the minister to:

- Confirm the current status of the upgrade
- Explain the cause of delays
- Provide a clear timeline for commencement and completion
- Commit to transparent communication with staff and stakeholders

We have requested an urgent written response by close of business Wednesday 28 May 2025.
