

ANMF EA UPDATE 4

Eskleigh Foundation Nurses Enterprise Agreement

Bargaining parties met earlier this week to further progress the negotiation of the nurses Enterprise Agreement (EA), with discussions focussed on final drafting.

Overtime for Casuals

The Australian Nursing and Midwifery Federation Tasmanian Branch (ANMF) raised concerns that the clause dealing with how casual nurses are paid overtime is subject to some uncertainty. The ANMF sought consistency with the Nurses Award 2020, which provides that overtime is cumulative on the casual rate.

Eskleigh has undertaken to give this issue further consideration.

Summary of Negotiations

As previously reported, the wage increases on offer are a minimum of 3.5% per annum, payable from 1 July each year, and Eskleigh has agreed to some condition improvements.

The wage increases on offer each year are formulated as being 'the higher of' a specified percentage increase or the percentage increase decided by the Fair Work Commission (FWC) in the Annual Wage Review that year. This year's Annual Wage Review decision is expected to become available in coming days.
