Royal Hobart Hospital – Ward 7A

Improved Benchmarking Proposal – Member Vote Needed

The Australian Nursing and Midwifery Federation Tasmanian Branch (ANMF) has received an updated benchmarking proposal for Ward 7A, following member feedback and ongoing consultation with the Tasmanian Health Service (THS). The proposal includes the following changes:

- **Increase of 1 Registered Nurse (RN) on the AM shift (weekdays).**
- **Increase of 1 RN on the IM shift (weekends).**
- **Removal of 1 Assistant in Nursing (AIN) on the ND shift (7 days/week).**
- **Addition of 1 RN on the ND shift (7 days/week).**
