Launceston General Hospital Northern Renal Unit

Renal North Dispute – Listed for Tasmanian Industrial Commission Conciliation

The Australian Nursing and Midwifery Federation Tasmanian Branch (ANMF) advises members that the dispute regarding staffing and workload concerns within the **Launceston General Hospital (LGH) Renal Unit and the Kings Meadows Satellite Unit** relating to 2023 benchmarking not being implemented on a permanent basis has now been formally listed for conciliation in the **Tasmanian Industrial Commission (TIC)** on **Friday 26 September 2025**.

The ANMF lodged this dispute following ongoing member reports of:

- The additional workload involved in onboarding agency staff employed on short 3-month contracts to fill staffing deficits.
- The unstable workforce creating further workload pressures.
- Gaps in roster cover.
- Ongoing challenges with skill mix and resourcing limitations.

What's next?

Conciliation provides an opportunity for the **ANMF** to put members' concerns formally before the **TIC** and seek enforceable outcomes. The **ANMF** will continue to represent members' interests strongly in this process.

We will provide further updates following the conciliation hearing.
