Allambi Relocation Consultation Process Flawed!

Australian Nursing and Midwifery Federation Tasmanian Branch (ANMF) Branch Secretary, Emily Shepherd, recently met with members to hear firsthand the concerns members raised around the Change Proposal to relocate Primary Health Services to a central business location.

It is evident that the Change Proposal outcome has followed a flawed process with over 800 submissions received yet, limited feedback provided.

A large number of the feedback received indicated the location proposed is highly unsuitable for clinical services, notwithstanding, the proposed location at 113 Cimetière Street appears to have already been decided.

The ANMF is seeking evidence from members of the professional and industrial impacts of the proposed relocation, for instance the increased personal safety risk of finishing late shifts and walking from cars back to the office or carrying heavy equipment down stair wells due to limited lift availability, or the lack of ability to ensure patient confidentiality with all the constant coming and going between staff and clients from a busy central business area. We are also keen to understand any workload concerns that may arise due to the added time needed to travel due to car and office location to see clients. The ANMF will de-identify your evidence as part of a submission to the Tasmanian Industrial Commission (TIC).
