The Australian Nursing and Midwifery Federation Tasmanian Branch (ANMF) received an overwhelming response, with the clear majority of Department of Critical Care Medicine (DCCM) members indicating strong support for pursuing pay parity with Emergency Department (ED) staff when working a 12.5-hour shift.

Based on this direction from members, the ANMF will now proceed with lodging an application.
