Tasmanian Health Service South Midlands Multi-Purpose Centre

The Australian Nursing and Midwifery Federation Tasmanian Branch (ANMF) would like to thank members from the Tasmanian Health Service (THS) Midlands Multi-Purpose Centre for their strong engagement at the recent member meeting held on Friday 9 January 2026.

The meeting provided an important opportunity to discuss the Enterprise Bargaining Agreement (EBA) and the current member surveys that are informing the development of ANMF's Log of Claims (LoC). Members were encouraged to continue participating in these surveys to ensure your priorities and concerns are accurately represented.

Members also discussed the District Hospitals Model of Care, highlighting that District Hospitals experience unique challenges and operate differently across sites. It was agreed that these local nuances must be clearly captured. As a result, the ANMF will be conducting a specific District Hospitals survey to better reflect these differences and strengthen advocacy on your behalf.

The meeting also acknowledged the planned expansion of the Midlands Multi-Purpose Centre, with an additional eight residential beds to be added. Construction is anticipated to be completed by **February 2027**. The ANMF has made clear that this expansion will require a congruent uplift in staffing to ensure safe workloads and quality care for residents and patients.

The ANMF thanks members again for their contributions and will continue to keep you updated as this work progresses. Members are encouraged to stay engaged and reach out to the ANMF with any questions or concerns.
