Southern Cross Care Tasmania Ainslie Low Head Concerns Raised

During a recent meeting with members concerns were raised around clinical governance, workloads and the safe delivery of care to residents.

The Australian Nursing and Midwifery Federation Tasmanian Branch (ANMF) has written to Southern Cross Care Tasmania (SCCT) local management to raise these concerns, with the request that the concerns raised are addressed in a meaningful way, so the delivery of evidence based clinically lead care is provided to the residents in care at Ainslie Low Head.

The ANMF will continue to follow up with SCCT to ensure concerns such as absence of clinical meetings, rostering practises, delays in vital communications and pathology results, are actioned in a way that allows the clinical team working on the floor to make clinical decisions that are aligned to the Aged Care Standards that are expected from them.

The ANMF continues to advocate for a workplace culture grounded in:

- Respect.
- Psychological safety.
- Fairness.
- Open communication.
- Supportive leadership.



We have made it clear to SCCT that behaviors or systems that create fear, silence, or excessive pressure on members are unacceptable and must be rectified immediately.
