

ANMF EA UPDATE 2

Corumbene Care Preparing to Bargain

Corumbene management is preparing for Enterprise Agreement (EA) bargaining and has engaged a consultant for assistance.

We are continuing our preparations and are developing a Log of Claims (LoC) based on your responses to our *Bargaining Priorities Survey*.

In our *Bargaining Priorities Survey*:

- 67% of respondents said it is very important for Corumbene to attract and retain quality staff; and,
- 100% of respondents consider Corumbene to be an employer of choice in aged care.

Through EA bargaining we can ensure Corumbene continues to be a great place to work.

Corumbene management is yet to provide the Australian Nursing and Midwifery Federation Tasmanian Branch (ANMF) with the current wages table showing how staff are paid. This is critical baseline information for bargaining.

In our *Bargaining Priorities Survey* respondents indicated they received wage increases in October 2025. This accords with Government Funding Guidance for the Aged Care Work Value Case.

Government Funding Guidance makes clear that EA bargaining is expected to continue in the usual way.



We will likely engage with members further to make sure we have a clear understanding of your current wages.
