Coroneagh Park Workload Concerns

We are writing to follow up on concerns that have been raised by members at Coroneagh Park regarding nursing workloads, staffing arrangements, and the impact these issues are having on day to day work and resident safety.

Members have reported a range of recurring issues, including:

- Increasing workload pressures associated with the introduction of the new E case system.
- Tasks being allocated without adequate consideration of existing workload, time required, or clinical standards.
- High reliance on agency staff, which can add to pressure on permanent staff.
- Nurses forgoing meal breaks or working beyond rostered hours to complete required work.

While there has been advice that an additional care worker is due to commence after Monday 20 April 2026, members have raised concerns that this alone does not address the broader workload and staffing issues being experienced by nursing staff.

To ensure we have a clear, accurate, and evidence based understanding of these issues, we are asking members to complete the attached confidential workload survey.
