Thank you for participating in the Enterprise Agreement (EA) survey for Lifeblood and making your voice heard. The Australian Nursing and Midwifery Federation (ANMF) has had hundreds of responses from across the country.

Lifeblood members in every state and territory are aligned. Members have said they want to see a fair pay rises without Thrive's pay-for-performance, safe staffing levels, respect for nurses' scope of practice, maintaining nurses at Lifeblood, donor safety over Key Performance Indicators (KPIs), fair rostering and improvements to workplace health and safety.

Now that we have collated your feedback, it is time to produce a Log of Claims (LoC) and design a bargaining campaign to ensure we can achieve as many of these goals as possible.

Bargaining for a new EA is a process that must be led and designed by you. We will have a meeting with any interested delegates to help union officials design the campaign and our LoC.

The LoC and campaign plan will be shared with all members once ready for your endorsement and feedback.

Thanks to your feedback in the survey, we now have a great idea as to what issues are most important to you.

We are expecting Lifeblood to initiate bargaining within a few weeks. Please make sure that your colleagues are members of the ANMF and have updated their contact information with their local branch of the union, so they are receiving up to date information.
