Care@Home and Ambulance Tasmania Change Proposal

Proposed Move From 89 Cambridge Park Drive, Cambridge to Level 13 110 Collins Street and 12 Brisbane Street – Member Feedback Requested

The Australian Nursing and Midwifery Federation Tasmanian Branch (ANMF) has been advised of a Change Proposal affecting Care@Home and Ambulance Tasmania staff currently based at Wing 2, 89 Cambridge Park Drive, Cambridge, as well as Care@Home night shift nursing staff currently working remotely.

What is Being Proposed?

The proposal follows recommendations from the Independent Review of Tasmania's Major Hospital Emergency Departments (2024), including the integration of Ambulance Tasmania's Clinical Hub with the Department of Health's Care@Home service to support access to virtual care and community-based referral pathways.

The Department proposes to vacate Wing 2 at 89 Cambridge Park Drive and relocate Care@Home teams to Hobart CBD locations. The proposed relocation is expected to occur in stages, subject to consultation outcomes and site readiness, with relocations proposed to occur before September 2026.

The proposal may affect Care@Home Virtual Care, Central Administration, Intermediate Care and Rostering teams currently located at Cambridge Park Drive. These teams are proposed to relocate across Level 13, 110 Collins Street and 12 Brisbane Street, Hobart.

The proposal also includes the relocation of five Ambulance Tasmania positions from 89 Cambridge Park Drive to 12 Brisbane Street, Hobart: Safety and Quality Officer; Clinical Nurse Consultant, Medical Care Plans;



Manager, Integrated Care; Nursing Director, Patient Transfer and Integrated Care; and Manager, Clinical Practice and Integrated Care.

Care@Home night shift nursing staff, who have been supported to work remotely due to work health and safety concerns at Cambridge Park during night hours, are proposed to transition back to a physical work location at 12 Brisbane Street.

What Could This Mean for Members?

- Change in work location from Cambridge to Hobart CBD sites.
- Potential changes to commute times and travel arrangements.
- Reduced availability of onsite personal car parking compared with current arrangements.
- Potential changes to work from home arrangements for Care@Home night shift nursing staff.
- Possible short-term disruption during packing, relocation and transition.

The Department has identified parking as a significant challenge, particularly for staff moving from a site with free onsite parking to CBD locations. The Department has indicated that public street parking is available for night shift staff and that one to two possible private night shift car parks are being explored.

The ANMF is Seeking Your Feedback

The ANMF is seeking feedback from affected members about the proposed change, including any impact on workload, safety, working arrangements, travel, parking, fatigue, consultation, and the proposed return of Care@Home night shift nurses to a physical work location.

Members are encouraged to complete the below ANMF survey by **Wednesday 1 July 2026** to allow feedback to be provided by **Monday 6 July 2026**. Individual responses will be treated confidentially and used to inform the ANMF's consultation response.
