Primary Health North Security Risk Response

The Australian Nursing and Midwifery Federation Tasmanian Branch (ANMF) is aware the services which have operated out of the Allambi building are currently in active relocation status. From the initial proposal to relocate these services to an inner-city site ANMF members have sought to be a part of the conversations, with hundreds of comments and submissions made to the Tasmanian Health Service (THS) relating to the relocation of these vital health services.

Many members voiced concerns around the safety of staff particularly for those that operate in an after-hours service delivery.

ANMF members have sought to have this safety risk analysed and, just prior to the relocation commencing, the THS have finally released their risk report.

Both the report from the Office of Chief Risk Officer and the responses to these risks are attached for your review.
