Log of Claims Endorsed – Bargaining to Commence

The Australian Nursing and Midwifery Federation Tasmanian Branch (**ANMF**) advises that participating members have endorsed the proposed Log of Claims (LoC) for bargaining with BaptistCare (your **Employer**), following member consultation led by the ANMF.

What This Means

The LoC outlines the wages, allowances and conditions the ANMF will pursue in Enterprise Agreement (EA) negotiations with your Employer.

The LoC was recently circulated to members for endorsement. While only a small number of responses were received, the majority of those who responded supported proceeding. The next steps are:

- The ANMF will formally serve the LoC on the Employer.
- Bargaining will commence in the lead-up to the expiry of the current Agreement on **31 October 2026**; and,
- The endorsed claims will form the foundation of negotiations for the new EA.

Next Steps

The ANMF will provide the endorsed LoC to the Employer and commence EA bargaining discussions.

As negotiations progress, members will continue to receive updates on key developments, including bargaining discussions, employer responses and any proposed offers.



Members are encouraged to stay engaged throughout bargaining and to participate in future surveys and feedback opportunities.
