Care@Home and Ambulance Tasmania Relocation Change Proposal Update

What Has Happened

The Australian Nursing and Midwifery Federation Tasmanian Branch (ANMF) has received a response from the Department of Health (DoH) about the proposed relocation of Care@Home with Ambulance Tasmania Secondary Triage services. The Department says consultation remains ongoing and final decisions will be communicated in the coming weeks.

What Members Raised

Members identified concerns about safe access to the proposed Brisbane Street Clinical Hub, parking, travel after dark, fatigue, confidential calls and video consultations, work-from-home arrangements, flexible work, communication, workflow, staff wellbeing, retention, and financial impacts.

What Has Changed or Been Clarified

The Department has confirmed Care@Home administration staff will be co-located with clinicians. It has also advised that a Work Health and Safety (WHS) assessment is being undertaken and that mitigation measures will be developed as part of implementation planning.

What the ANMF is Doing

The ANMF will continue to advocate for members, monitor implementation planning, and raise unresolved safety, access, workload, confidentiality, wellbeing, financial impact and flexible work concerns with the Department.



What Members Should Do Now

Continue to provide feedback to your ANMF organiser or the ANMF Member Support Team.

Raise any safety, access, parking, fatigue, workload, confidentiality, financial impact or wellbeing concerns as soon as possible.

If you need flexible working arrangements, contact management directly to discuss your circumstances and organise a flexible workplace agreement where required.
