Sub-Acute, Aged and Community Services Argyle Street Move Change Proposal Member Update

The Australian Nursing and Midwifery Federation Tasmanian Branch (ANMF) has received further correspondence from the Tasmanian Health Service (THS) regarding its overdue response to the ANMF's feedback on the proposed Sub-Acute, Aged and Community Services (SAACS) Argyle Street Move Change Proposal.

The THS was due to provide its written feedback response by **Wednesday 29 July 2026**, however it has advised the ANMF that, due to several unplanned staff absences and leave, it has been unable to finalise the response within the expected timeframe.

The THS has requested a further extension until **close of business Wednesday 5 August 2026** to allow sufficient time to complete a thorough review and ensure all feedback is appropriately considered.

The ANMF acknowledges members' frustration that the THS has again delayed providing its response, particularly given the impact this proposal may have on workplaces, workloads, consultation rights and staff morale. While the delay is disappointing, the ANMF's focus remains on ensuring the THS provides the right information, answers members' concerns properly, and undertakes genuine consultation before any decision is made or the proposal progresses.

The ANMF will continue to pursue a full written response from the THS and will provide members with the THS's formal response once it is received next week.
