Statewide Mental Health Services

Change Proposal – Stage Two – Relocation from 110 Collins Street to 175 Collins Street

The Australian Nursing and Midwifery Federation Tasmanian Branch (ANMF) has been advised by the Department of Health (DoH) of Stage Two of its Change Proposal, which affects members within the Statewide Mental Health Services (SMHS) Education and Practice Development Unit.

What is Proposed?

As part of the Department's ongoing office accommodation review, the manager and three educators currently based at **Level 13, 110 Collins Street** are proposed to relocate to **175 Collins Street** by **Sunday 1 November 2026**.

The Department advises that this relocation is intended to:

- Co-locate SMHS teams within the same service stream.
- Improve collaboration and communication between teams.
- Make better use of existing office accommodation.
- Create capacity for teams transferring into the DoH following Machinery of Government changes.

The Department states that no further relocations are currently proposed for the remaining SMHS staff located at Level 13, 110 Collins Street.

What Impacts are Expected?

According to the proposal, impacts are expected to be minimal and may include:



- A change in work location.
- Changes to desk allocation.
- Minor adjustments to commuting arrangements.

The Department advises that the working environment at 175 Collins Street is similar to the current office setting and that service delivery impacts are expected to be minimal.

The Department has requested feedback by **Wednesday 16 September 2026**.
