This workshop is designed for nurses and midwives keen to better understand the obligations and requirements of their nursing registration as stipulated by the Nursing and Midwifery Board of Australia (NMBA) and governed by the Australian Health Practitioners Board of Australia (AHPRA).

1 March 2018 will see changes to the code of professional conduct for nurses and midwives implemented alongside the adoption of the International Council of Nurses (ICN) Code of ethics. We will outline these updates and what it means for you.

Continuing Professional Development (CPD) registration responsibilities will also be clearly defined. You will have the opportunity to select your best suited CPD template or app for current CPD to be entered in.

Lastly, time will be allocated for the establishment of your individualised CPD plan for the coming 12 months and the workshop will wind up with a brainstorming session on an in-service need in your current workplace with tips on how best to deliver that training.

09:35 – 09:50	Outline structure of NMBA and AHPRA	 It is the Nursing and Midwifery Board of Australia (NMBA) that define the requirements of practicing nurses and midwives in Australia. The Australian Health Practitioners Regulation Agency (AHPRA) is the organisation responsible for the implementation of the National Registration and Accreditation scheme across Australia. They ensure nursing and midwifery regulations are adhered to as a requirement of registration.
09:50 – 10:05	The code of conduct for nurses and the code of conduct in midwifery changes explained	 The latest code of conduct for nurses and midwives will come into effect on the 1st March 2018. The NMBA state that "all nurses and midwives have their own personal values and beliefs - but the code of conduct provides specific standards of conduct and behaviour. All nurses and midwives in Australia need to meet the standards set in these codes, even if their employer also has a code of conduct."
10:05 – 10:20	Adoption of the International Council of Nurses Code of ethics in Nursing and Code of ethics in Midwifery	The NMBA, Australian College of Midwives (ACM), Australian College of Nursing (ACN) and Australian Nursing and Midwifery Federation (ANMF) have agreed to jointly adopt the International Confederation of Nurses (ICN) code of ethics for nurses and the code of ethics for midwives in Australia effective 1st March 2018. Learn what this means for you.
10:20 – 10:45	CPD - obligations and responsibilities	Many workplaces require staff to complete mandatory training on a regular basis. The NMBA outline various requirement for CPD in the NMBA Regulation Standard. Often, nurses and midwives become confused between the two. Although both are compulsory, and there may well be some crossover, there are also some fundamental differences. You will learn what these differences are during this session.
